The first stage of the Asia Cup 2017 due to be held in Delhi, India at the end of January has been postponed by the organisers due to "reasons out of our control". The next stage in the continental series will take place in Bangkok, Thailand on 19-26 March. Legs are also planned in Taipei City, Chinese Taipei and Tehran, Iran.

Nimes 2017

Rio 2016 Olympic silver medallist JC Valladont, shooting at his home club, beat London 2012 Olympic Champion Oh Jin Hyek to recurve men's gold at the third stage of the 2016/17 Indoor Archery World Cup in Nimes, France.

Record holder for the 18-metre ranking round Brady Ellison beat first-time finalist Tom Hall to the recurve men's bronze medal. The recurve women's win went to Claudia Mandia over Korea's Jin Yun, while Naomi Folkard took bronze.

Denmark was three for three in compound finals on the event. Reigning World Archery Champion Stephan Hansen cleanly beat the winner of the worlds in 2001, Dejan Sitar, in the men's final. Tanja Jensen took compound women's gold ahead of Natalia Avdeeva – and Sarah Sonnichsen won the bronze medal match against Mariia Vinogradova.

Youth Olympic Games

The Youth Olympic Village (YOV) will be located in the southern part of the City of Buenos Aires within Parque de la Ciudad, a public green space oriented toward recreational use. Integrated inside the Youth Olympic Park, the Youth Olympic Village will be the Buenos Aires 2018 epicentre where all the participants will reside (live, rest, eat and sleep) during the Youth Olympic Games. The YOYV will be shaped by 31 buildings that will house the residents' apartments.

Event fees

In December 2016, World Archery Executive Board agreed on new event fees that will come into effect for 2017, except for entry fees which will be in 2018.

All fees in CHF (Euro and USD just for reference):

- ✓ Athlete Max 250 CHF 250 USD/230 EUR
- ✓ Team Official Max 125 CHF 125 USD/115 EUR
- ✓ Double entry fee for own bookings

➤ Other fees

- ✓ **New:** Athlete acting as coach (to be paid to World Archery Accreditation) 30 CHF
- ✓ Lost accreditation 30 CHF
- ✓ Late entries (entries after the final entry deadline) 50 CHF
- ✓ If no preliminary entry, or if final entry contains more than 4 differences from preliminary for athletes and officials 150 CHF
- ✓ **New:** Changes to athlete and/or team officials names after the final entry and within 3 days prior to start of event (to be paid to World Archery Accreditation) 50 CHF
- ✓ **New:** Fee to LOC for athletes not entered through WAREOS at world ranking events 5 CHF/athlete

Achievements

Indoor world record

Brady Ellison scored 599 out of a possible 600 points at the third stage of the 2016/17 Indoor Archery World Cup in Nîmes, France to break his own world record for the 60-arrow 18-metre indoor ranking round by a single point, dropping just one arrow out of the 10 ring during his qualification. The Rio 2016 Olympic individual bronze medallist was only one off perfect.

Para world record

Great Britain's Jess Stretton, the gold medallist in the women's W1 competition at the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games, increased her own world record for the 72-arrow 50-metre ranking round by seven points to 656 out of a possible 720 during qualification at the third Fazza International Para Archery Competition in Dubai. Stretton had set the previous record of 649 points at the same event one year prior.

Para Archery

The classification of para athletes takes place at two levels.

1. National classification

Member associations will have their own rules about classifying their athletes to compete in domestic (national) competitions based on international classification rules. They can use a single classifier panel instead of two classifiers required internationally to determine the class of impairment.

They can have their own classes of impairment, can decide what, if any, assistive devices may be used. The intention is to encourage more persons with a disability to participate in archery.

These rules would apply only to the country that created them and the classification provided is only for competitions in that one country. To compete internationally a further classification is required.

It is recommended that national classification is based on international classification rules (W1, W2 and ST classification classes) plus eventual additional national classes or subclasses. This will help to identify potential national team members in para archery.

2. International classification

To be permitted to participate in international para archery events, the athlete must comply with the World Archery classification criteria. These criteria are part of the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) Code of Classification and its various appendices, adapted to be specific to archery.

International classification is carried out by a panel of two international classifiers before a major para tournament. World Archery appoints the international classifiers to tournaments where the tournament organisers have asked for them. It is the responsibility of the organising committee to pay the travel and accommodation costs for the international classifiers appointed to the tournament.

Detailed classification rules and information – A handbook for classifiers - will be published 1 April 2017 on the World Archery website.

International classification applications

So that a complete programme of service provision by World Archery is given to the tournament organisers, the organisers are asked to advise World Archery jkleee@archery.org of the dates, venue and type of para tournament they wish to run, and request the provision of International classifiers.

It will be necessary for this request to be made 12 months in advance so that a programme can be drawn up, classifiers invited to apply to serve, and then tournaments allocated. Then the classifiers will know in good time to which tournaments they have been appointed, can arrange their leave from work or other responsibilities and discuss travel with the organisers to get the best flights.

Member associations are requested to apply to World Archery for classification at their 2018 international events not later than 1 September 2017.

Members

Is your national federation active?

World Archery would like to remind the member associations of the following two articles from the Rule Book:

1.4.2.5.1. *Being an active member means:*

- *Organise a national championship in target archery at least once every Olympiad in both genders;*
- *Have a minimum of 30 registered/member athletes. For countries where the population is less than 1 million or which have started archery in the last Olympiad, this minimum is 10. For countries where the population is less than 200.000 this minimum is 5;*
- *Report to World Archery every 4 years on their activities;*
- *Have anti-doping rules that are in compliance with the World Archery Anti-Doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Code;*
- *Be a member in good standing and implement good governance practices.*

1.4.2.5.2. *In case a Member Association does not fulfil the requirements of being an active member, a warning will be sent. If no corrective action is initiated prior to the next Congress, they will be recommended for expulsion.*

Costa Rica

In 2015, after a long process, Costa Rica created the Federación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco (FEDETICA), including three different associations as its current members: Asociación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco (ATACR), Asociación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco de Alajuela (ASTICA), and Asociación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco de Occidente (ADETAO).

The internal process with the National Institute of Sports was then finished last year, and FEDETICA is now the national representative of the sport of archery in the country.

On 22 December 2016, the Ordinary General Assembly of the Asociación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco (ATACR) approved to send a request to World Archery to pass on the international representation of the sport to the Federación Deportiva de Tiro con Arco (FEDETICA).

On 19 January 2017, FEDETICA was accepted by World Archery as a member association and recognised as the only governing body for archery in Costa Rica.

African Development Agent

Since 2006, World Archery has contracted a development agent with the mission of developing archery in West Africa. Paul Zinsou, who held the position from its inception until the end of 2016, was able to introduce a solid base for the sport in several countries.

After a decade, the project was reassessed with the Foundation for Global Sports Development, adjusted to encompass the entire African continent and focus on youth development, and it was decided to re-advertise the role.



Khaled Sofiane Lamandé, a 36-year old from Algeria who speaks three languages – English, French and Arabic – was selected following open applications.

World Archery welcomes Khaled and encourages its member federations in Africa to both support him in his new role and take advantages of the upcoming programmes and initiatives he will coordinate in the continent.
