Athletes of the Year

Hyundai Archery World Cup Champions Mike Schloesser and Sara Lopez retained their World Archery Athlete of the Year titles for 2019. It is the third time Mike has won the award and the fifth consecutive trophy for Sara. World Archery Champion Brady Ellison and world number one Kang Chae Young were named the best recurve archers of last year. The awards are decided by a combination of public and expert votes.

Hyundai World Cup 2020

The Shanghai stage of the 2020 Hyundai Archery World Cup in May will be moved as the city will instead host this year's Hyundai Archery World Cup Final in the autumn. World Archery had been monitoring the situation around the COVID-19 outbreak since late January. A change to the calendar was required in view of recently introduced travel restrictions on athletes and officials, and the packed international schedule.

Antalya 2020

Antalya is set to replace the postponed second stage of the 2020 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Shanghai. The event will also be delayed by one week from its original schedule and now take place on 11-17 May, which will allow many athletes to remain in Antalya for the European Championships on 20-26 May. Antalya will host a stage of the international circuit for a 15th consecutive season.

World Series Finals

Californian 24-year-old Paige Pearce won the first major target title of her senior career as she beat Lisell Jaatma in the compound women's final at the 2020 Indoor Archery World Series Finals on home soil in Las Vegas, USA. Mike Schloesser, Florian Kahllund and Wi Nayeon also took titles in Vegas. The circuit started back in November 2019 and has visited six cities around the world.

Team Competition

Squads from Lancaster Archery Supply and Mathews won the top prizes in the team competition for the 2020 Indoor Archery World Series. The Lancaster recurve group, led by world number one Brady Ellison and featuring his US teammates Jack Williams and Casey Kaufhold, accrued 3405 ranking points, more than double of second-ranked Beiter. Braden Gellenthien, James Lutz and Tanja Jensen put Mathews at the top of the compound ranking since scoring big at the fifth stage in Nimes.

The Vegas Shoot

Twenty-two-year-old Kyle Douglas beat 22 other men in the championship open shootdown in Vegas to win the tournament's biggest prize of 54,000 USD. The relatively unknown archer out of Utah had previously won the young adult championship at the Vegas Shoot. This was his first time making the last line in the main event. More than 3800 archers competed in the largest Vegas Shoot ever in 2020.

ISSF Championships

The Bangladesh Archery Federation has postponed the ISSF International Solidarity Championships scheduled to be held in Dhaka on 22-28 February. A number of teams withdrew due to travel restrictions and ongoing concerns around the COVID-19 (coronavirus) outbreak. This meant the event was no longer feasible. The tournament will be rescheduled at a later date.





Gymnasiade 2020

The Gymnasiade is an eight-day multisport event for young athletes organised by International School Sport Federation with approximately 3000 participants. The next edition will be held in Jinjiang, China on 17-24 October 2020. Archery is one of the core sports and athletes born on 2003-2005 are welcome to enter (registration through national school sport federations https://isfsports.org/countries). The organising committee offers accommodation, food and transportation free of charge and special deal for flight tickets is available until the end of March.

Chandigarh 2022

The Commonwealth Games Federation has approved a plan for a Commonwealth Archery and Shooting Championships to be held in Chandigarh, India in January 2022. It comes after neither sport was approved as an optional addition to the programme of the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. Medals won at the championships will be included in a combined final medal table issued one week after the Games conclude.













Birmingham 2021

There will be two archery disciplines represented at the 2021 World Games in Birmingham, USA. A total of 100 archers will take part: 48 in the field and 52 in the target archery competitions. Find a guide to the qualification process that starts in the summer of 2020 and ends at the start of April 2021, and will allocate quotas to national federations, who will then be able to enter athletes to the multisport event.

National trials

Miguel Alvarino Garcia has been named as the archer who will fill the single spot that Spain has currently qualified for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games following the conclusion of national trials in Madrid. That quota place was won by Pablo Acha for his bronze medal at the 2019 European Games in Minsk, Belarus. Spain's last Olympic archery medal came at Barcelona 1992. Tokyo will be Alvarino Garica's second Olympics.

They'll be joined by Olympic silver medallist Jean-Charles Valladont and Lauréna Villard for the third stage of the Hyundai Archery World Cup in Berlin, which is the final qualification tournament for Tokyo.

A World Archery level 3 coaching course was conducted on 24 February to 1 March at the World Archery Excellence Centre in Lausanne. Experts Pascal Colmaire, Juan Carlos Holgado and Jeoung Kyeong Su trained 12 candidate coaches from 10 countries with the skills to train elite athletes to a world-class level and develop high-performance programmes within their respective federations.
